Musical Pancakes: Musical Chairs with pancakes.

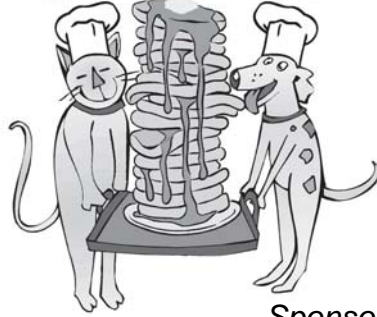

We always see double during kitten and puppy season. This year, we can save even more young animals with your help. Puppies and kittens often have very little natural immunity because their parents have not been vaccinated. The result is lots of runny noses and lots of antibiotics!

By delaying our outdoor improvements for a year, we have made our funds go further than even we thought they would. Mr. and Mrs. Harry Reaugh donated enough oilfield pipe to make posts for all of our new perimeter security fence. A grant from the Community Foundation of Abilene provided the funds for the rest of the fence material.

After we added free labor for installation, we wound up with over \$20,000 worth of fencing that did not have to come out of our regular donations, leaving all that money to directly benefit our animals.

We are in the final phase of finishing our exercise yards, grading, leveling, planting grass, trees, and shrubs, and building a covered pavilion for outdoor activities and sidewalks. More Dachshunds will be Ready by Race Time!



Our Director, Mindi Qualls, noticed a slightly pudgy Dachshund at the pound. The card said that Molly was "fixed," which would mean she could be off to a new home quickly. When Mindi and Molly visited further, something did not seem quite right, and Dr. Allen Bolt's sonogram confirmed that

Molly was just days away from having at least 7 puppies! Three days later Molly had 8 puppies and they should be ready for new homes in time for our July 12th Dachshund Races. We assume the card should have said, "She is in a fix," instead of "she is fixed!"

THERE'S A NEW SHERIFF IN TOWNOR MAYBE TWO.

The new Sheriff in town is **Les Bruce**, a veteran of the Abilene Police Department. Taking office in January, Sheriff Bruce has acted quickly to continue the department's fine tradition of acting aggressively to protect animals. Sheriff Bruce toured our Adoption Center and met the staff.

Three starving dogs were recently seized by the department. Two of the dogs were nothing but skin and bones and a third was being held in a cage with absolutely no food, water, or a gate! Craig Griffis of the Sheriff's Department had to use wire cutters to open the cage and free the dog. We look forward to working with Sheriff Bruce and his fine team of officers to protect the animals of Taylor County.

Aaron Vannoy, the second new "Sheriff" in town, hit the ground running in March as the new Director of the City of Abilene Animal Services (the pound). Aaron previously worked for the local Red Cross and Boys and Girls Clubs of Abilene.

Our first chance to work with Aaron happened almost immediately when an owner in ill health had to take four bird dogs to the pound. Fortunately, it was the week of the Safety City Clay Shoot. We called Jennifer Stuckey with Safety City to see if the dogs could come to the Shoot to find new homes. The answer was yes! Aaron arranged for the four bird dogs plus a Lab to go. Rudy Fernandez from KEAN 105 talked the dogs up at the clay shoot, and 3 of the bird dogs and the Lab were all adopted thanks to Jennifer Sharp of Animal Services who introduced them to everyone at the event. The fourth bird dog is now at our Adoption Center.

Aaron's fast start at Animal Services continued the next week with a savage cruelty case. A pit puppy about 10 weeks old was attacked by its owner. The man broke the puppy's jaw and several ribs. The poor puppy had to be euthanized. Thanks to the hard work of the APD and Animal Control Officers Samantha Freeman and Jennifer Sharp, the owner was arrested and jailed on felony animal cruelty charges.

A donkey wandering down the street started the next animal case. While checking on the donkey, an officer noticed a horse tied to a pole. The piles of manure showed that the horse had been there for a very long time. When the horse was inspected, an abscess the size of a softball was found on its nose. Animal Services secured a warrant to seize the horse and had a veterinarian examine it. The vet concluded that the infection was so far along that the animal should be euthanized. The owner had been using an antibiotic spray on the wound instead of seeking proper medical care. The City is in the process of filing charges against the owner for failure to provide adequate care (Class C misdemeanor). Animal Services records indicate that the horse was loose in traffic some weeks earlier and was struck by a car, which probably caused the abscess.

While in the neighborhood, the officers noticed a horse hobbling around in another yard nearby. This second horse appeared to have an infected foot and was also taken in for a vet exam. Again, the prognosis was that the infection was too far advanced to save the animal. The owner said the horse had been purchased recently as a gift. Charges will probably be filed in this case as well.

More Time for Cats! 7 Days Not 3!

Aaron has also directed that all healthy adoptable cats be held for a full week instead of the previous 3 days! We are still working with the City on their expansion plans in hopes that soon we will be able to make the same deal for all healthy adoptable dogs.

Working with Abilene Animal Services, we are trying to encourage anyone who sees an animal that is not being properly cared for to call both Rescue the Animals, SPCA and Abilene Animal Services.
